BUILD A RAMP AND MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN SOMEONE'S LIFE





#### WHAT WE DO

We begin by assessing the property where the consumer needs the ramp. If everything works, we create a ramp design and get the appropriate permits. We then pre-build the ramp sections at our shop on our Sylvania campus. On the day of the build, we load and transport the ramp, start the layout and set the posts.

#### WHAT YOU DO

#### First and foremost: HAVE FUN!

You will help us assemble the ramp. This involves aiding in layout, helping to level and secure the platforms and slopes, and screwing boards. You will also assist with drilling, digging, grading, sanding, and job site clean up. Lots of fun stuff.

#### WHAT YOU NEED TO BRING

Please wear comfortable (but not loose) clothing you don't mind getting dirty, and closed-toe shoes or boots for safety. We will provide gloves, ear and eye protection.

In all cases, we provide cold fluids and we have been known to spring for lunch (hope you like pizza). Feel free to bring your own too.
